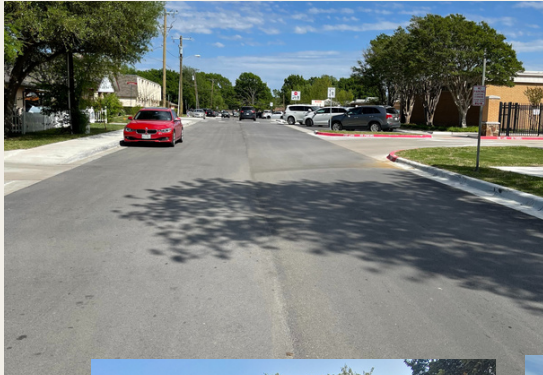

TARRANT COUNTY, TEXAS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Since 1974, Tarrant County has received \$171,148,390 in Community Development (CDBG) funds. The majority of funds are used to help consortium cities improve infrastructure: water, sewer, streets, sidewalks, parks, and senior centers. Remaining funds pay for home repairs, assisting people experiencing homelessness, youth programs and emergency assistance.



Since 1992, \$44,594,845 in HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) funds allowed for the addition of single and multi-family housing units throughout Tarrant County and enabled seniors, families, and persons with disabilities to receive home repairs. Through education and work sessions such as human-centered design exercises with residents, the County can gain a better understanding of local needs.
